

Tax Exemption Forms: Takes a 10min phone call

Non-USA Nationals are required to apply for a recognized EIN tax number (employment identification number) as part of their sign-up form until ASEA are officially open. The process to obtain this number is simple- 10 minutes or less and can be done:

1. Online at <https://sa.www4.irs.gov/modiein/individual/index.jsp>
2. Over the phone by calling the IRS: +1 267 941 1099 between 6am – 11pm US Eastern Time. This is free and they do not require any official papers, just your basic details.

The majority of worldwide countries have a double tax treaty with the USA, so you will not be required to file annual tax forms, nor will you be charged tax on any earnings in the US. You will need to complete a W-8BEN tax exemption once you have your EIN. This form needs to be printed, completed and kept with your records <http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/fw8ben.pdf>

The EIN is for you as a sole-trader, networking for commission payments. Even if you are ordering only for personal use you will still need this number in order to sign-up. If you already have an EIN number then we can continue with the process.

The information you will need to provide the IRS is included below:

First and Last Name

Phone Number

What is your position in the entity you are calling in reference to? Sole Trader

Do you have a US identifying number or social security number? No

What country is your business in? Your country of residence

When did you start trading? Starting now

What is your home mailing address?

What is your reason for applying for the number? Sourcing products from the US

Is there anyone employed in the business? No

What is the principal activity of the business? Networking for Commission
